From the Pastor: Growing

Have you ever noticed that kids and plants don't seem to grow very fast when you see them every day? But the first time you see them after an extended period of time, you are amazed at how much they have grown. While growth is important, it is not always a very visible process. Sometimes we don't see the growth. Other times we are looking for growth in the wrong place.

Whether you realize it or not, our family we call Peace has been growing steadily over the years. This growth doesn't always show up in worship service attendance because some people you are used to seeing at one service may be going to a different service. With youth events and confirmation classes on Sunday evenings, you may not be seeing as many youth at our morning services as in the past. Many of them come on Sunday evening.

Another reason that our growth doesn't show up in worship attendance is because a significant number of the people who worship with us at Peace are not able to attend services every weekend because of work or other responsibilities. If everyone came to worship services every Sunday, our worship attendance would be significantly higher.

One place that we can track the growth of our church is in baptized and confirmed members. Our baptized membership has grown from 206 at the start of 2010 to 409 at the start of this year. Our confirmed membership during the same time has grown from 196 to 306.

But we don't want to just grow in numbers. We also need to grow in faith, in our relationship with God and each other, in our knowledge of God's Word and in living out our Christian faith. Peace is not an organization. It is a living organism made up of people who love and follow Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior.

The more our faith grows, the better knowledge and understanding we have of God's Word, the more opportunities will open for us to build relationships with people who don't follow Jesus. When these opportunities come, we can tell our family, friends, neighbors, classmates and coworkers the story about the difference Jesus makes in our lives. When we let them know that God loves them and wants to make a difference for the good in their lives, the Holy Spirit can work in their lives to help them want know more about Jesus and enter into a relationship with Him. When we grow in faith and become a living witness for the Lord, God's Kingdom will grow too. Isn't that what God wants? Isn't that what God wants us to do? YES!

If we all make a concerted effort with the Holy Spirit's help to grow in faith and faithfulness, God will use us to reach others for Christ and God's kingdom will grow. We may not see it right away, but it will. Our responsibility is to plant the seed. God will make it grow.

February 10th “Voluntold” Luke 5:1-11

Jesus isn't looking for volunteers. He isn't looking for the brightest and the best.

Jesus qualifies the unqualified. His first Disciples were “Voluntold”, not volunteers.

February 17th “Dream On” Luke 6:17-26

We may dream for an easy, comfortable life. Dream on! That is not likely to happen for the Christian who is challenged by Jesus to go where no one else wants to go & do what no one else wants to do.

February 24th “Do No Harm” Luke 6:27-38

Doctors take an oath to do no harm. Christians are called to do the same by loving our enemies, going the extra mile and refusing to join in the blame / judgment game.

Any interested teen musicians are welcome to join the Youth Praise Band, “God Squad”. Whether you play an instrument or like to sing we would love to have you!

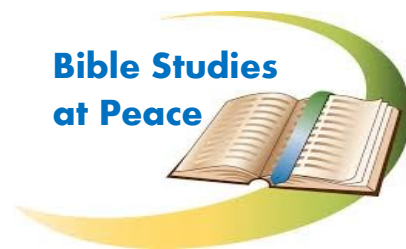
The group meets most Sunday nights from 7:45 - 8:15 in the youth room.

This will be an introduction and sharing of information on what prayer shawls are, how they are made, etc. The group will then meet every other Monday, 7:00—9:00 PM. Prayer Shawls are given to those undergoing medical procedures; as a comfort after a loss or in times of stress; during bereavement; during an illness and recovery, or simply for encouragement.

Prayer Shawls may be knitted, crocheted, (any yarn, any color), made out of fleece or quilted. Each meeting will open with devotions, discussion, maybe snacks, as well as time to sit and create together. We will end with a closing prayer.

Peace Leadership Goal's Summary Report

Critical Targets

The Elders, Directors and other Leaders of Peace met on Saturday, January 26th, to consider our vision and our goals for Peace. At the conclusion of the morning, the leaders identified critical targets for ministry in the next two years. These were narrowed down to a top list of five critical targets for Peace. These targets were not prioritized. Instead they will become the focus for specific groups, tasks force and leadership teams. Here are our critical targets for 2019 and 2020 to help move Peace forward with the Holy Spirit's help.

Grow the number of small group Bible studies @ Peace with increased participation both by members of Peace and those who may not already be part of our Peace family. This will require the recruiting and training of additional small group Bible study leaders and giving everyone the opportunity to participate in a group study.

Help the members of our Peace family become more personally accountable for their growth as God's people demonstrating they are disciples of Jesus Christ. This will require and equipping people to worship more regularly, to use their time and abilities in serving others, to a greater participation in Bible Study and a growing number of people who give a percentage of their income to the Lord.

Train and equip members of our Peace family for greater outreach to our friends and neighbors. This begins with our Directors and Elders taking a personal Spiritual Gift survey at their meetings this month. Then other members of the Peace family will be given the opportunity to take their own Spiritual Gifts survey, to identify their gifts and look for opportunities to use them to the glory of God. We will also take time to learn how to tell our faith stories to others.

Increase the generous stewardship of our Peace family so that we can expand the ministry of Peace. Two key goals are to be able to grow our ministry staff and restore the 10% support of our church body. This means gaining a greater understanding of Christians stewardship, of returning to God what He gives to us in the first place.

Grow the Ministry Staff of Peace so that we can better equip and serve our youth and young families to grow in faith and live out their faith in an increasing secular world. Hitting the four critical targets listed above will help us move in this direction.

Please pray that God will give us the wisdom and guidance of His Spirit to do the things that are the most important in His eyes to fulfill the vision He has given us. Then look for ways that you can make changes in your personal life and get involved in serving the Lord through Peace. A special thanks to Pastor Mike Ruhl for facilitating this workshop.
