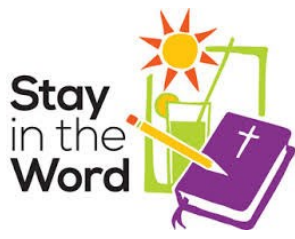

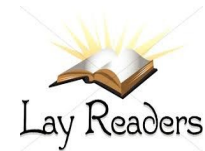

## Potential Service and Outreach Projects

### Sensory Chairs

Children diagnosed with autism have challenges with sensory overload. The Sensory Chair, designed with input from a family with a son with autism and therapists, was created by “May We Help” in Cincinnati to provide an enclosed, secure, distraction-free space that allows him the movement he needs to adjust and perform repetitive calming behaviors, to concentrate, and to relax. We have a prototype based on their plans at Peace. The hope is that we will be able to raise funds to not only make these sensory chairs but to have a work day when people can come together for a build day.

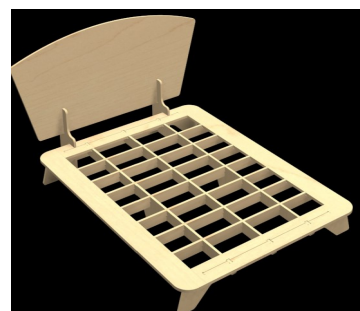
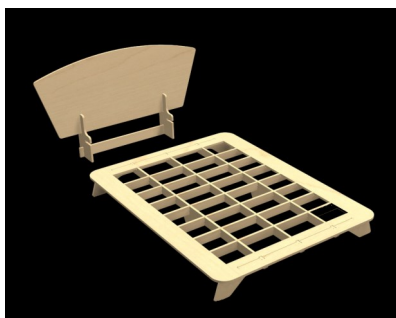

### Foster Children’s Twin Beds

Peace has a growing relationship with those who serve Foster Children in Washtenaw County. One need that comes up regularly is for twin beds for children placed suddenly with extended family members who do not have a bed for these children to sleep in. The twin bed pictured here is made out of one sheet of 3/4 “ plywood (1/2 sheet for the head board) and cut on a CNC machine. Like with the Sensory Chair, the hope is to raise funds to make these beds and have a build day when people can come together to finish the beds and get them ready to give to the Foster Children. ## **The Children!**

Have you ever experienced the bold, confident child that was willing to approach anyone, even a stranger, with the expectant question, “Can I have this”? The child didn’t just ask for a piece of candy from the store clerk but might have even asked for the neighborhood kid’s favorite toy.

This was the child that totally embarrassed their parents by posing the same question in the most inappropriate situations. Maybe the family stopped getting invitations or politely declined for fear of what might happen next.

Kids can be a real hassle, and when you think about what the disciples may have experienced with children, maybe you can’t blame them for their reaction as you read Mark 10.

People were bringing the little children to Jesus to have Him touch them, but the disciples rebuked them. When Jesus saw this, He was indignant. He said to them, “Let the little children come to me and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. I tell you the truth, anyone who will not receive the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it”. And He took the children in His arms, put His hands on them and blessed them. Mark 10:13-16

The truth is, children can be messy. Children are often selfish, need to learn about the world and can be amazingly destructive left to their own devices. Remember the child that tried to stick the butter knife into the socket, not once but twice? You thought they would have learned their lesson the first time. But you can’t help but admire the tenacity, the single minded nature of a child.

Maybe that’s the example we as adults should look to when it comes to our faith. Too often we stop short of following God’s will because we get uncomfortable or are afraid we may be embarrassed. But we will always be children in God’s eyes: messy, selfish, often being influenced by the world. God wants us to make Him the focus of our hearts.

Take a lesson from the children. Pursue God boldly and don’t pay attention what others think, for the Kingdom of God belongs to such as these.
