From the Pastor. . . “Questions”

Our lives are full of questions. A big question this year is who will be elected President of the United States in November? We don't even know who at least one of the major party's candidate will be, so how can we possibly know who will be elected?

People are asking me what I am going to do after I retire in June. I don't really know. I have a good idea of what I would like to do, but don't know if my plans or ideas will work out. (I plan to tell you more about what I hope to do after retirement when we get closer to that date.) Between now and then I hope to faithfully serve as the Pastor of Peace and help keep preparing Peace for the transition. I would like to strengthen the ties we have into our community and set the stage for the people Peace to serve and extend God's love to the people around us.

We are in the early days of the Lenten Season. There were a lot of questions about Jesus before He made his final journey to Jerusalem. Would He go to Jerusalem? Or would He stay in Galilee and play it safe? Was He going to launch a revolution to overthrow the Romans who occupied Israel? Or did He have a different mission in mind? We are going to look at some of the important questions during our Sunday services that were raised during Jesus' final journey to Jerusalem. These will all be questions we should consider and answer for ourselves.

People still have a lot of questions about Jesus. Some want to know who He is. Others question whether or not He is who He claims to be. There are a growing number of people who question why anyone would want to follow Him. They might ask, “Who needs Jesus anyway?”

The answer is we all need Jesus. We all need the love, forgiveness and new life that only Jesus can give. Why? Because we are living in a world that has fallen under the influence of sin. Because we are living in a time when too many people are turning their backs on God and doing their own thing. Because our relationship with God is broken and we can't repair it by ourselves.

Why did Jesus come into our world? God gives us the answer in a short letter written by Jesus' Disciple John to the early Christians. John wrote, *“God showed how much he loved us by sending his one and only Son into the world so that we might have eternal life through him. This is real love—not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as a sacrifice to take away our sins.”* (1 John 4:9-10 New Living Translation)

What difference does this make in our lives? John tells us in the next verse. *“Dear friends, since God loved us that much, we surely ought to love each other.”* God's love has the power to change us so that we can love each other. When we let God's love reach out to others through us, the lives of the people around us are made better.

Let me ask you a couple of questions. What difference is Jesus making in your life? How are you making a difference for the good in the lives of the people around you because of God's love in your life?

The Reading for February 21st was 1 Thessalonians 5:16-17 – *Rejoice always, pray without ceasing*. Billy Graham tells us that when we are busy we can "pray without ceasing" in our hearts and minds. It is not enough to just bow our head when we got out of bed in the morning or before we go to sleep at night. We can pray anywhere and anytime and God will hear us. Even a few minutes alone with God during our busy day can reap rich rewards.

I know when different events happen, like somebody cutting me off in traffic or somebody leaves their grocery cart in the middle of a parking space I react as I imagine most people do, then I have to ask God to forgive my thoughts and then the anger diminishes. Pray for any little thing that upsets you and you will find that as you share this with God it calms you down.

Hope for Today statement is "*Prayer is not isolated activity; it is ongoing throughout the day. When we seek to hear from God, we will find He is always available and ever eager to speak to His children. We pray with our words and find answers in His Word.*"
